

Technical Bulletin – 07-03
Approved Helmets for Midget and Below for 2007 Season

February 9, 2007

Due to some confusion regarding what helmet and facemask combinations can be used for the 2007 season in Minor Lacrosse (Midget and below), the Equipment Review Committee has decided to release a **FINAL** Technical Bulletin on this issue.

In Minor Lacrosse, the following can be used:

1. A Helmet that is CSA approved for hockey with the following facemasks:
 - a. CSA approved facemask for hockey that is hinged and strapped properly.
 - b. OTNY Jr. model lacrosse facemask that is hinged and strapped properly.
 - c. OTNY Intermediate model lacrosse facemask that is hinged and strapped properly.
 - d. NAMI Jr. model lacrosse facemask that is hinged and strapped properly.
 - e. NAMI Intermediate model lacrosse facemask that is hinged and strapped properly.
 - f. Calcoat lacrosse facemask that is hinged and strapped properly.

Please note: The Canadian Lacrosse Association and the Canadian Standards Association are meeting on a regular basis an update for the 2008 season will follow by March 30.

2. A NOSCAE helmet and facemask combination such as, but not limited to:

- STRYKE
- CASCADE
- RIDDELL
- BRINE
- GAIT

Note: Provided they are not altered in any way.

The OTNY Sr., NAMI Sr. and the 3 bar O'Neill Model **ARE NOT** permitted in Minor Lacrosse

1. Does not come under the chin
2. It is not hinged.
3. Has no chin cup protector.
4. Any other mask that is permanently affixed to a CSA approved hockey helmet and is not hinged will not be permitted in minor lacrosse.
